COMMUNITY PLANNING UPDATE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. This paper profiles developments within the Community Planning Partnership's (CPP) structure, along with the CPP proposal around locality planning.

SUMMARY

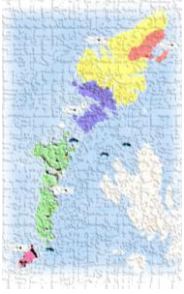
3. A proposal for the future structure of the CPP was discussed at the November meeting. Members are asked to note the IJB's continuing involvement, albeit that the parent bodies will maintain a lead role.
4. Members are also asked to note that under the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015, CPPs are required to undertake locality planning. Unlike the IJB's Locality Planning Groups, the CPP has opted for a targeted approach, focusing on those areas with the poorest outcomes. Stornoway West and Benbecula/North Uist have been identified as the areas locally as experiencing poorer outcomes, and the CPP will work with these communities to develop locality plans in the first instance. The CPP recognises that there will be a need to connect this to the work already underway in respect of health and social care.

RECOMMENDATIONS

5. It is recommended that the IJB:
 - a. Notes the position of the CPP in respect of the reform of its structures;
 - b. Notes the position of the CPP in respect of its locality planning arrangements;
