To enable this, the contract with GPs is in transition – we are moving towards the widespread adoption of cluster working (where GP practices will seek to learn from each other to improve quality) and develop a more diverse range of services provided by a range of professionals, such as Advanced Nurse Practitioners, Physician Assistants or Paramedics. In addition, GPs will be supported to exert greater influence over local health and social care systems to ensure that they are more responsive to patients' needs. We are also working to enhance our GP workforce through a specific primary care recruitment and retention programme. A local Primary Care Improvement Plan is in place, with subsequent direction given to NHS Western Isles in respect of the implementation of national and local priorities.
